

# Fleetville Diaries AGM Minutes

November 25<sup>th</sup> 2015

Community Centre, Fleetville at 7.30pm

Present: FB, LB, JC, VF, MG, HG, LH, MN, CP, TS, DW, JA, JB, AB, GB, CB, PE, SG, SK, AS Apols: PE. We were pleased to welcome three new guests at our meeting.



1. Liz welcomed all members to this year's Annual General Meeting.
2. Liz read the Annual Report to members and a couple of minor corrections were made. **(Please see the Report, Financial Report and draft programme tacked onto the end of these minutes).**
3. Liz talked through the plans for the coming year expanding on the proposed activities and asked members for their comments and suggestions. The programme for 2016 looks very promising.
4. Dave talked through the key points from the 2013/2014 financial statement which had previously been circulated to members and also displayed at the meeting. We began our financial year with a balance of £331.54 and ended the financial year on 2nd October 2015 with a balance of £1153.54 Our healthier financial status is thanks to a transfer of £600.00 from the break-up of the Fleetville Festival Committee. Jo Bates proposed signing off the report and accounts and Carol Parker seconded it.
5. Membership fees remain at £10 and run for a 12 month period from January 2016. Additional fees for walks remaining at £1 for members while non-members will still pay £3 for meetings and walks. Meetings will continue to take place on Wednesdays in the Bycullah Room.
6. There were no requests from the current 6 committee members to stand down and no further nominations were received. All 6 were re-elected; Graham Bosely proposed the committee members and Paul Eland seconded it. It was assumed that Peter Elliott (Apol) is still happy to continue.
7. The last activity in 2015 will be an informal Christmas get-together in the Community Centre on 16th December at 6 pm. **Please let Liz know if you wish to come along.**
8. Mike rounded off the evening by showing a film of St Albans from the British Film Institute website. It was an amateur film probably done by someone who lived at 61 Cambridge Road, judging by the camera angles. It featured scenes from Verulamium, Camp, Highfield and Fleetville. We were able to ask Mike to freeze the film. This BFI website allows us to see a number of films free of charge which some of you might find very interesting.

## Annual Report November 2015

### Status

Fleetville Diaries is a fully constituted voluntary group. It is a member of CVS and takes out Public Liability Insurance annually.

### Projects 1 and 4 The Cambridge Road Project/Members' Research

We are particularly pleased with the way you, our members, have embraced the Cambridge Road Project. In early June, the residents of Cambridge Road were invited to attend a meeting at the Royston Club. Turn-out was really very encouraging and Mike, Romaine, Anne Marie, Diana, Paul and I (Liz Bloom) had the pleasure of meeting a number of residents and ex-residents who had stories, photos, maps and house deeds to show us. We have now formed a committee and are looking forward to presenting these findings to you in January. Maps, house histories, land transference, personal stories and much more! Because another of our members, Romaine, has already started a history of Camp View Road, it looks as if Fleetville Diaries will be featuring a series of street histories in the future under the name of 'Right Up Our Street'

### Project 2 Website

Unfortunately, we have made little headway with the website this year. I am updating the Home page with details of forthcoming events, of course, but we are still hoping that somebody in our membership might step forward to offer their skills in re-building the site and in doing so, to create a blog page and make it easier to navigate.

### Project 3 New Talks

Mike and I have been busy working as guest speakers at local interest groups such as U3A, women's clubs and older people's groups. It's surprising how word gets round! We have collected £275 in donations over the past 12 months and Mike and I agree that in 2016, Fleetville Diaries will be in a good enough position to give our talk donations to the new Museum fund. Between us, we can offer 16 different talks; most of which have been created by Mike. Have a look at the website list and tell all your friends.

### Project 5 Links with the Highfield Trust

I must say that our friends at the Highfield Trust won't let the grass grow under their feet! No sooner had we suggested in 2014 that we would like to strengthen our ties with them by donating a tree than we were contacted by Sue with a list of trees we could choose and a date for the planting – just before Christmas 2014! Our beautiful Tulip Tree can now be admired at the green space near the maze, next to the pathway. Thank you Highfield Trust.

### Project 6 Social Event

The highlight of last summer was, for me, the wonderful garden party at Terry's house on Beaumont Avenue. I was quite blown away by Terry's generosity in opening up his garden; providing chairs, tables and gazebos; attending to health and safety; and even thinking about all the finishing touches like table decorations. I have to say that Diana played no small part in this by providing proper china cups, saucers and plates, and by staffing the tea tent; not only that but she took it all away to be washed up! I was amazed by the fantastic support that Terry's family gave in running an excellent barbeque in the corner of the garden – all for us! The weather was very kind to us and so many people flocked in. To top it all, Terry has agreed to host another one next year. Many thanks to you, Terry and Helen, and to your lovely family.

### Trips

In June, our walk around Wheathampstead was well-attended again; this year it included a trip to the old station. I know that everyone is always impressed by Patrick McNeill's commitment and excellent delivery. I only wish I could have been there! Our second excursion was to the old Leavesden Psychiatric Hospital where the very lively Martin Brooks took us on an energetic walk around the grounds of what is now an

impressive park; a little chilly but well worth the effort. On both of these occasions, we were, of course, driven in the minibus by Vic. His work is not always straightforward; at Leavesden, he was unable to find a high enough entrance for the bus but with some help from Martin on the phone, he eventually ferried a buss full of trippers safely into the park. Great work and thank you, Vic.

### **Work in the Community**

In addition to the talks that Mike and I are giving to local groups, Mike has been heavily involved with the Smallford Station project under the leadership of Geoff Lewis. In fact, he created last year's exhibition all about the Smallford station. The exhibition visited the Fleetville Festival, Larks in the Parks and National Older People's Day, to name but a few places.

### **Other History Groups and Activities**

- Mike is a driving force behind the St Albans and District Local History Network which held its fifth annual conference in October. Once again, delegates were treated to some excellent talks which reveal the extraordinary work being done in the county. I urge you to attend next year!

### **Members**

- Last January we accepted 26 membership fees of £10 per member entitling free entry to meetings and a half price concession on guided walks. This was an increase of 6 on the previous year. The January to January membership has made things so much easier to handle because we aren't collecting fees at the AGM as in the past. Thanks to Lorraine who acts as a membership secretary.
- Many thanks to members who helped by carting things around and pitching the gazebo at the Fleetville Festival and at Larks in the Parks. We also thank Diana Devereux for providing welcome refreshments at our meetings.

### **The Committee**

- Members from November 2014 to 2015 have been Mike Neighbour, Peter Elliott, Lorraine Hammond, Dave Wilson, Diana Devereux and Liz Bloom. 2015 committee meetings were held in April, October and November. During these meetings, invoiced expenses submitted by committee members were paid according to the rules of the FD bank account. Unless the committee members change, Mike, Liz, and Peter will continue to be bank account signatories. Our particular thanks to Dave who is meticulous in his accounting and very prompt when reimbursing us!

### **Next Year**

- Although the name of Fleetville Diaries is beginning to be recognised now beyond the bounds of this ward, Lorraine and Liz will continue to work towards raising our profile in St Albans by way of social networking, media and other conventional publicity.
- There will be no change in our membership fees and structure this year.
- Local Engagement – Cambridge Road will be featured in a new guided walk and exhibition in 2016. The Cambridge Road team will be presenting the data collected during the course of this year.
- Website – We are still looking for someone interested in our work to become involved in running our website.
- New Talks – Liz and Mike will doubtless be creating further talks from material collected for the guided walks. They are intended to be 'virtual walks' for the elderly and infirm. We hope we can collect a small income for FD from these talks.
- Members' research. Liz will be presenting one of two talks about A J Nicholson and Co to Fleetville Diaries in 2016. Alan Cannon Jones, who was an apprentice there, and from a family that lived on Hedley Road since the birth of Fleetville, will be sharing the commentary.

- Links with the Smallford Station project. We are hoping that one of our excursions next year will consist of a guided walk around the Smallford area. The other will be to the RAF Museum in Hendon.
- Social Event – The aforementioned garden party on July 9<sup>th</sup> 2016 will probably feature an ‘entrance tombola’ which will help towards our finances. We hope the sun will shine because we are planning to provide more shade for you all.
- Kate Bretherton has accepted an invitation to guide us round the fantastic specimen trees in Clarence Park in June. If you haven’t done this walk in the past, don’t miss the opportunity next year! She is a very engaging speaker.
- Again, meetings and guided walks in 2016 will be held on WEDNESDAYS except the cemetery walks which will be on Saturday afternoons.
